CCCC Function Codes

These are functional/organizational descriptions for the expense.
For example, 2400 is school administration

DDDDD Object Codes

These are called object codes and describe the nature of an expense.
For example, 52100 is health insurance

EEE Program Codes

These codes help to define an account in an extra way when needed.
For example, for every special education expense to be reimbursed, we use 211 here.
